

Year 4 Topics





English: We will continue to follow the 'text**based** curriculum' designed around children reading a text over 4 weeks. The term begins with a 2 week unit examining poetry, focussing on The Utterly Brilliant Poetry Anthology. The 'Read, Write Inc.' programme will be followed by children who need extra grounding in reading, writing and phonics.

During Terms 3 & 4 we will be reading;

Term 3: The Utterly Brilliant Poetry Anthology

Gangsta Granny

The Hundred Mile Dog

Term 4: Archie's War

Within the 'text-based curriculum' key skills of spelling, grammar, writing, reading, vocabulary building and speaking and listening will be taught.

Maths: We will be following the new maths curriculum which is organised into 7 concept areas. The children are in learning groups according to their needs and rate of progress. Homework is set using MyMaths, an online program, and weekly tables. Expectation of tables to be known in each year group has increased with the new curriculum. Children in Year 4 should now aim to know all their tables up to 12x12. Keep

working on helping your child learn their tables forwards, backwards and in random order, along with quick-fire mental arithmetic calculations

Topic Work: At Upton we are continuing to follow the IPC (International Primary Curriculum). Foundation subjects such as History, Geography and Science will be taught and linked through different topics, so it will be an exciting year ahead. Year 4 topics for Term 3 and 4 include TEMPLES, TOMBS AND TREASURES —finding out about the Ancient Egyptians and

LAND, SEA AND SKY - living things, food



Computing Skills: This term develops the children's use of presentation software, PowerPoint. The first three lessons, teach children new skills; setting the theme, slide transitions, animating objects onto the slide, creating hyperlinks in the action settings. During the next lessons,

Design and Technology: Our Design and Technology task will be to design and make an Egyptian mask. On Egyptian day, children will also work with clay to create their own cartouche.
